

STEMFEST NET ZERO

Dear Parent/Guardian,

Face to face events are back and in direct response to the growing alternative energy sector in our region, the North East STEM Hub are delighted to announce that they will be delivering a face to face and virtual (hybrid) event around the theme of 'Net Zero' in partnership with Newcastle United Foundation. On behalf of the partnership between the North East STEM Hub and the Newcastle United Foundation, we are delighted to be welcoming your child to STEMfest Net Zero at St James' Park, Newcastle Upon Tyne on the 4th, 5th, 6th July.

The event is split into 5 zones, Power and Natural Resources, Climate and Adaptation, Business and Industry, Buildings and Construction, and Transport. Our exhibiting businesses will be delivering fun, interactive and hands on sessions relating to their industry, specifically in response to Climate Change and their plans to reach Net Zero by 2030.

To ensure that all participating children can have the best experience at STEMfest Net Zero, we do have some information to share with you.

On the day, lunch will not be provided for students so a packed lunch will be required. Please can you bear in mind that we are operating on a 'No Nuts' policy for those at the event who may have severe allergies.

St James' Park is a public building but we will not be allowing members of the public to enter the event, therefore, please ensure your child is wearing school uniform so that they can easily be identified as a visiting student.

We will have a photographer and film crew at the event. So, if your child can not feature on any photos or videos from the event, please inform the school so they can make us aware upon arrival. These students will be issued a red lanyard and the photographers and videographers will ensure they do not feature in any media from the event.

St Johns Ambulance will be in attendance at the event with a designated first aid room if required. We also have a quiet room for students with additional needs who may require some time out of the event and a prayer room has been allocated for any students who may require this facility during their visit.

There is no storage available at the event so we would encourage children to travel lightly and leave valuable items at home. We can not guarantee that there will be a lost property service available but we will do our best to ensure lost items can be stored somewhere for collection.
